Summary update on our Performance Report (previously called Improvement Plan) 2009-12

In 2009 the Council set and published 13 priorities across a 3- year period between 2009 and 2012. The priorities were chosen for a wide range of reasons, some because we wanted to perform better, some containing projects and areas of work that would be financially or politically important and some based on citizen feedback. As this period draws to a close, we want to give you an update on our achievements to date.

In the words of Anthony O'Sullivan, our Chief Executive;

...'by working together we are making great strides in achieving strategic objectives across all our service areas.

We recognise that in the current difficult financial climate we must streamline our operations across the organisation, which we have been doing very effectively to date whilst ensuring that the impact on frontline services is kept to a minimum.

We will continue to build on our successes and target any shortcomings to deliver services that make a difference to the lives of our citizens and provide value for money at all times'
