www.blackwoodminersinstitute.com); the BBC National Orchestra of Wales Audience


Line (**03700 10 10 51**); or in person through the 'Visit Caerphilly' centre. Tickets are also available on the day for £12.

School meal prices frozen

For the third consecutive year, the Council's Catering Services are freezing the price of school meals for the new school year in September.

Primary school meals will cost just £1.80, with secondary school meals just £2.05, but children will still benefit from quality products from local suppliers. As well as working with local suppliers, recent links with Birds Eye have resulted in a healthier fish finger. Already in primary schools in Caerphilly, and reaching secondary schools in September, the new fish finger complies with nutritional standards and won't strain budgets.

Cllr Dave Poole, Cabinet Member for Community and Leisure Services, said, "The authority is committed to providing nutritious and exciting meals for our school children. We can assure parents that all food and drink available at school are first class and meet specifications that are outlined by Welsh Government, despite budgetary restraints."

Bargoed Bowls Pavilion rises from ashes

A popular community facility in Bargoed has reopened to the public after being restored to its former glory.

Bargoed Bowls Pavilion has been completely redeveloped after arsonists destroyed the old building for a second time in February 2011. The old modular buildings had been subject to two attacks in 10 years, leaving the pavilion beyond repair. The new structure is a traditional style building making it more secure and less susceptible to any arson attempts in the future.

Cllr David Poole, Cabinet Member for Community and Leisure Services welcomed the new building, "I am delighted to announce the re-opening of the Bargoed Bowls Pavilion. The new premises are not only more secure, but also boast better facilities and are more accessible. It is important that local people have community facilities and green spaces such as this to enjoy."

The new pavilion will enable residents to continue using the bowling green and the building for a variety of functions in the future. Cllr. Tudor Davies, President of Bargoed Bowls Club said "On behalf of the members I wish to express their great appreciation for those council officers who's efforts and support enabled the new pavilion to be built."

New Weish school plans on track

Exciting plans to develop a new Welsh school for children living in the Caerphilly basin area are pressing ahead.

Cllr Rhianon Passmore, Cabinet Member for Education said, "Demand for Welsh Medium education has been steadily increasing over recent years and there is now an urgent need to provide additional Welsh secondary places within the county borough."

The current Welsh secondary school at Ysgol Gyfun Cwm Rhymni has reached full capacity and is projected to exceed capacity by 900+ pupils by 2021. The council submitted a successful 21st Century Schools bid of £20m to the Welsh Government last year. The bid was to make provision for up to an additional 900 secondary places on the former St.llan school site in Caerphilly, as well as relocating YGG Caerffili into the site.

"This ambitious proposal involves expanding Ysgol Gyfun Cwm Rhymni at the former St. Ilan site, in addition to its present location at Fleur de Lys, to accommodate the continuing increasing demand for Welsh education. This will form part of an overall strategy to develop a 3-19 campus with impressive facilities, such as a four court sports hall and many other shared facilities on the site," added Cllr Passmore.



Consultation will take place in November for all interested parties to find out more and have their say on the plans. School pupils, staff, governors and parents will get the chance to attend special meetings, but the main public meetings are as follows:

Two attractive country parks in the county borough have been awarded prestigious Green Flags.

The popular Parc Cwm Darran near Deri and Cwmcarn Forest are the latest sites in the Caerphilly area to win the much soughtafter accolade. Cllr Ken James welcomed the news, "We are delighted that Parc Cwm Darran and Cwmcarn Forest are the latest attractions to receive this prestigious green award. This helps highlight the fantastic open spaces we have here in the county borough."

Three local parks already have a Green Flag - Morgan Jones Park in Caerphilly, Waunfawr Park in Crosskeys and Nelson Wern Park - but these are the first country parks to receive the award, which is a sign to visitors that the site is well-maintained and well-managed, with excellent facilities.

Proposals to tackle poverty approved

Caerphilly County Borough Council has officially supported proposals to introduce a Living Wage, which will be implemented from 1st October 2012.

At a meeting of Council recently, members agreed to the ambitious plans to eradicate the problem of those living below the poverty threshold in the area - by ensuring that council employees are paid a minimum of £7.20 per hour.

Cllr Harry Andrews, Leader of the Council said, "This significant decision, which received overwhelming support from members, really fits in with our vision to tackle poverty and improve living standards for our lowest paid employees."

He continued, "This decision illustrates that we are taking a stand for the 3,000+ employees on low wages, the majority of whom are female, frontline staff, by ensuring that none of our workforce earn below the minimum wage."

While the primary benefits of the initiative are to ensure all employees wages are increased above the poverty line, other benefits evidenced from research include a

reduction in absenteeism, easier recruitment and retention and improved morale, motivation and commitment.

Cllr Keith Reynolds, Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member with responsibility for Corporate Services added, "This far reaching initiative forms a key part of our wider regeneration plans for the whole county borough. As a community leader, we will also work hard to promote the benefits of implementing the Living Wage to other employers in the area."

Highway improvements completed

A major £14million scheme to improve the road network around the new hospital development in Ystrad Myanch has been completed.

The Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr Highway Improvements will help tackle congestion and improve traffic flow at this key strategic intersection between the A469 and the A472.

The Leader of CCBC, Cllr Harry Andrews unveiled a special plaque at the site. "I am delighted to officially mark the completion of three major phases of work that will help improve the highway network at this busy location. I'd like to thank local people for their patience during the works and now look forward to seeing the benefits that the improved layout will bring." he said.

Work started in 2009 on phase one of the scheme which saw the construction of a new bridge from the A469 allowing vehicular access to the impressive new hospital site at Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr.

This was followed by two further phases of improvement work aimed at cutting congestion and enhancing traffic flow through the area.

The approaches to the Cwm Ddu roundabout have been reconfigured and a new dedicated link road – named Ludwigsburger Strasse in honour of our twin town - has been constructed to carry traffic direct from the A469 to Maesycwmmer.



Newbridge's new look is taking shape!

The regeneration of Newbridge is well underway, with re-paving works now completed in many streets throughout the town, and re-alignment works to key road junctions continuing.

Phase 1 of the town centre enhancements is set to continue until later this year and will give the town a bright new look, with the introduction of wider, safer pavements, better road surfaces and enhanced public spaces - all created with high quality paving materials, attractive street furniture and distinctive community-led artwork. The restoration of the historic Memorial Hall & Institute buildings is also on track, with the new Institute link block structure in place and internal refurbishment works underway. The ambitious plans will see the buildings fully restored and revitalised as the cultural hub of the town.



Cllr Ken James, Cabinet Member for Regeneration said: "There are exciting times ahead for Newbridge with the improvement works now really taking shape. We will continue to work closely with local traders to make sure that everyone knows that the town remains fully open for business and to encourage everyone to support their local businesses during the works."

Alun Griffiths (Contractors) Ltd, who are delivering the town centre enhancement scheme, will continue to keep local businesses and residents fully informed of the progress of works. The Newbridge Regeneration Programme is part funded by the European Regional Development Fund through the Welsh Government, Welsh Government's Targeted Match Fund, Heritage Lottery, Arts Council for Wales together with significant contributions from the Council and community organisations, amongst others. Convenient community hub at Risca Palace

The council is bringing even more community services to residents, with a new collection point for Islwyn Community Credit Union joining the popular library and Customer First services already available at the recently renovated Risca Palace.

Islwyn Community Credit Union began in 1998 as a community run financial co-operative, which encourages its members to save before borrowing. Similar to a bank, its members can access loans, but with much lower interest rates. The new collection point located at Risca Palace on a Tuesday afternoon joins a number of other collection points across the borough including Markham, Trinant and Blackwood. Work Underway on New Integrated Health and Social Care Centre in Rhymney

Work started on site in April 2012 on a new integrated health and social care centre on the Lawn Industrial Estate in Rhymney. The first phase of work has involved clearing the site, laying pilings for the building's foundations and removing and relocating a public footpath which crosses the site. Construction of the building has also now commenced.

The development confirms the commitment given to the local population during public consultation on Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr, the new local general hospital in Ystrad Mynach, and is designed to address the particular needs of communities in the North of Caerphilly County Borough.

MedicX, the UK healthcare property investor and developer was appointed in 2009 to design and build the centre and the company has worked closely with Aneurin Bevan Health Board, Caerphilly County Borough Council, the Welsh Government and local GPs to design a modern purpose built health and social care facility. A Community Forum, made up of local residents, voluntary organisations, elected members and health and social care professionals, has also been involved in the planning, ensuring a local say on the facilities offered.

Scheduled to open in the summer of 2013, the centre will complement the range of services provided in Ysbyty Ystrad Fawr. Services planned for the centre include 2 GP practices, a dental practice, optometry suite and social services day opportunities. In addition, the centre will act as a base for health and social care staff working in the North of the borough who provide care to a wide

range of people including children, older people, and people receiving mental health support. The centre will also have 12 in-patient beds, 2 of which will be designated for palliative care.



Bronwen John, Head of Partnerships and Networks for the Health Board, who is the Project Manager for the scheme, said that the new centre would bring a number of different services together in one building. "This is effectively a satellite of the new hospital and the services to be provided have been debated and agreed through the Community Forum, by the people who will ultimately be using them. It's an exciting time for healthcare in Caerphilly County Borough as we are working to expand the range of treatment and care services available locally through the building of modern facilities such as the new hospital and now the resource centre for the North. Local people will have access to a wider range of services than were previously available" she said.

Albert Heaney, Corporate Director Social Services at Caerphilly County Borough Council said, "The centre will enhance existing community services capacity and bring together a number of health and social care teams who will provide services in the community and from the centre itself. I look forward to seeing this impressive facility come to fruition over the coming months as work progresses."

Ashley Heath (Healthcare Property Director – MedicX) said, 'Modern healthcare facilities, that can be delivered within budget and provide value for money, are essential for local communities. We are confident that this fantastic new centre will transform the patient experience. We are delighted to be developing this state of the art health and social care centre in Rhymney, in partnership with Aneurin Bevan Health Board, Caerphilly County Borough Council, the Welsh Government and the local GPs and we hope everyone will be delighted with what will eventually be achieved.'

Partners and MedicX are keen to keep in close contact with the community in the North and are planning to hold further meetings of the Community Forum as the project progresses.



The Police and Crime Commissioner is a new role that will replace your local police authority. Police and Crime Commissioners will be responsible for the strategic management of the police and the appointment of the Chief Constable who will maintain operational control of the force. If you are not already registered you need to apply by **31st**

October to be able to have your say. If you would like to apply for a postal vote then you need to do so by 5pm on the same date (31st October). The deadline for a new proxy vote is 7th November at 5pm.

For this election a new voting system called the Supplementary Vote will be used. You will be able to vote for your first and second choice (if there's more than two candidates). If a candidate receives more than half of all first choice votes, they are elected immediately. If this does not happen, the two candidates with the most first choice votes go through to a second round. All other candidates are eliminated, but their second choice votes for either of the top two candidates are added to the totals for those two candidates from the first round. The candidate with the highest combined total of first and second choice votes will be elected.
