BE SCAM AWARE

Unfortunately anyone can be targeted by a scam at any time and in many cases the victim may not even realise that they have been targeted. There are many different types of scams and they take many different forms. It is important that you remain vigilant at all times and if you are unsure about something then make sure that you thoroughly check it out before going any further or seek advice. There is help out there, but ultimately if you are unsure then say no or do not proceed.

If you are a victim of a scam then the worst thing you can do is to do nothing. This will only result in the fraudster getting away with what they have done and is free to target other victims. By acting on your misfortune and reporting the scam you may well help to make sure that others don't fall victim to the same fraud. If the scam



is financial then you must contact your bank or card provider immediately, and tell them how you have been affected. This will enable your bank or card provider to act quickly and prevent you losing more money. They may even have a chance of pursuing the fraudster.

You can report the scam to the police and you can contact Action Fraud using the online fraud reporting tool on their website www.actionfraud.police.uk. You can do this any time of the day or night. You can also report fraud by calling the Action Fraud team on 0300 123 2040.

If you're concerned about any callers to your home or sheltered housing scheme do not allow them access and contact the

STAY SAFE THIS CHRISTMAS

As the festive season approaches, we wanted to take this opportunity to offer some fire safety advice when thinking about your Christmas decorations.

- Keep all corridors and escape routes clear at all times.
- · Don't obstruct fire doors.
- Don't cover any essential signage, e.g. emergency signs, fire notices, etc.
- Don't overload sockets or extension leads. If you

- do use an extension lead make sure wires aren't trailing across the floor, causing a trip hazard.
- Don't place fairy lights next to any flammable materials and remember to turn lights off when you go out and overnight.
- Don't use outside lights in an inside area and vice versa.
- Avoid using candles.
- Avoid decorations made of light tissue or cardboard.

 Don't put decorations near any source of heat, e.g. on top of radiators. Also, if you have portable heaters, avoid placing them close to furnishings or decorations.

ACTIVITIES ROUND UP

The past year has seen over 200 activities, events and trips held for sheltered housing tenants.

As well as regular coffee mornings and bingo, tenants have also been getting creative in arts and crafts sessions. In addition, schemes have enjoyed school choir performances, pamper sessions delivered by students from Coleg Gwent and first aid awareness training from British Red Cross. Connect Gwent and South Wales Fire and Rescue Service have also delivered a number of crime prevention and fire safety talks in our sheltered housing schemes.

Future activities and events planned include gentle exercise classes, talks on preventing falls, IT classes and gardening clubs. We also hope to build on the success of the intergenerational project held between tenants at St Gwladys Court in Bargoed and pupils from the nearby Heolddu Comprehensive School, by rolling this out to other schemes.

WELSH HOUSING QUALITY STANDARD UPDATE

Our Welsh Housing Quality Standard (WHQS) improvement programme continues to make great progress in our sheltered housing schemes. Some schemes have had a considerable amount of work carried out and we're very grateful to all tenants affected for their patience and understanding.

INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL IMPROVEMENTS

Since the start of this financial year, internal and external works have been completed at Ty Mynyddislwyn, Pleasant Place and Oaklands.

We're still carrying out work at a number of schemes,

including St Gwladys Court, Grove Estate, Alexandra Court, Prospect Place, Tredegar Court and Heol Islwyn. Works have also recently begun at Hafod y Bryn and works are due to begin soon at Greenacre Drive. There are also a number of schemes where, due to the scale of the works needed, improvements will be carried out after 2020. Meetings have now been held with tenants at each of these schemes to inform them what to expect and when.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENTS

Thanks to everyone who took the time to meet with our WHQS Environmental Officers to discuss improvements in the outdoor spaces at your schemes. Thanks to your input environmental improvements at sheltered housing schemes is also progressing well.

Environmental improvements have been completed at Horeb Court, Maesteg, Gwyddon Court and The Ranks. Work is still ongoing to deliver environmental improvements at Y Glyn, Prospect Place, St Clare's, Waunrhydd, Oaklands,

St Gwladys Court, Ysgwyddgwyn, Glynsyfi, Grove Estate 1 & 2, Pleasant Place, Ty Bedwellty, Greenacre Drive, The Willows, Glyn Derw, Alexandra Court, Ty Mynyddislwyn and Woodland View.
