## Dear colleagues

I hope this email finds you well. As we approach the Welsh Government lockdown review on Friday, I thought it would be helpful if I offered you a detailed Covid update.

Generally, things are showing significant improvement all across Wales, in Gwent and across the county borough. I've provided the tables below as it provides you with detail of the new cases and positivity rates. You can see lots of green arrows pointing downwards which is good news and you will find us just below the national average, which is a significant improvement to where we were a few weeks ago – you will recall we were in the region of 900 cases per 100,000 population.



Hospitals across Gwent and Wales as a whole are still under significant pressure but the numbers of in-patients being treated for COVID are falling gradually, albeit still above the Wave 1 peak. Unfortunately, there is still tragedy involved with the disease with the U.K. topping 100,000 deaths yesterday and Wales closing in on 5,000. The media coverage on this yesterday and this morning has been heart-wrenching, as it has reminded me that there are real people behind each of these numbers.

Whilst Wales is getting safer, it is not yet safe. Things may be getting better but they are not yet good enough. We are still in ALERT LEVEL 4 with all the restrictions this brings and we have been here for a month. I'd love to say that things will change shortly but I don't anticipate this changing when the First Minister makes his address on Friday setting out his three weekly review findings. Although there may be some indication from him, on how children will return to school shortly.

The vaccination programme is featuring regularly through the national media and appears to be a national political hot potato! This vaccination programme is massive and you would have noted earlier that we are playing our part, offering up Newbridge Leisure Centre as a mass vaccination centre.

The table below is accurate as of yesterday.



I know all of this feels a bit like "ground-hog" day. We have come so far but still have such a long way to go with many months of this in front of us. If Wales Government are to achieve their target of priority groups 1-4 being vaccinated by mid-February, then 22,539 vaccinations have to be delivered. Quite a large number, I'm sure you will agree.

Across the county borough all GPs are playing their part and New Tredegar and Caerphilly Leisure centres will be used to help the GP vaccination programmes in those areas. You will also be aware that our very own Ty Penallta has played a valuable role in offering vaccinations for our communities for a number of weeks. Newbridge Leisure Centre opens on the weekend, to replace Ty Penallta as it offers much more capacity and allows about 1000 vaccinations to be delivered each day. Although, this does give me a headache in terms of the forthcoming May elections, as I use both Newbridge and Caerphilly Leisure centres for the election counts.

Whilst Covid is enough to keep us all busy, we have been stretched even further. Over the last week, we've been dealing with floods, snow as well as our 800 other services that we continue to provide. I continue to be overwhelmed by the many great examples of public service at its best. Our schools are open with a combination of face to face, on-line and blended learning and like many of you I have first-hand experience of the daily challenges that come with home learning, but it is likely to continue for some while yet - so lots of deep breaths will be needed!

As ever please look after yourself and don't forget to let me or your manager know if you need any help.

Remember we are in this to the end and we're in it together. We have to pace ourselves so we all get there in one piece, to allow us to then re-group and deliver great things once again.

Easy to say I know, far harder to do – but I know I have the best team alongside me!
