- Ceri Pritchard (DWP Partnership Manager) gave a presentation outlining the roll out of Caerphilly Universal Credit Full Service 8<sup>th</sup> September 18
- The current 6 benefits will be under one umbrella of UC
- There will be a triage approach customer, work coach and case manager
- Work with key partners to support vulnerable customers
- Ex Service Personnel are placed in the tier two of vulnerable customersr

## 8.0 UPDATE FROM CAFF MEMBERS

#### 8.1 SSAFA

- Remains busy with a spike in Council Tax and housing arrears
- Continue to cover prisons. Problems arise on prisoner release
- Funded a lay-back bike raised £10000 of £12000 required
- Funded a ice trike £4500
- Increase in cases from the Welsh Guards
- Continues to have many requests to help pay for funerals
- All staff are required to hold a DBS and complete training every 3 years
- GDPR compliant

#### 8.2 BLESMA

- Introduction of Blesma to the Forum members. Tom Hall is the lead Rep for Blesma (The Limbless Veterans) in Wales and he is now joined by Jason Suller, the new Blesma Outreach Officer.
- The Blesma Outreach programme in Wales is for Veteran to Veteran activity, events, community and covenant projects and volunteer work. Also includes fundraising, using volunteers and Blesma members.
- Tom Hall updated forum members that there is now strong Blesma Support in Wales and this is
  open to any serving or ex-serviceperson who has lost a limb, or the use of a limb, use of sight, and
  for cases in-service: hearing or speech. Please refer anyone you find who could be entitled to

- Blesma has launched a radical new approach to get the best for veterans and their families who are
  trying to cope with the wide-ranging impacts of limb loss. Findings from the Blesma Families
  Project have identified the need for significant changes in the way support is given to both
  Members and their family carers. The study interviewed and surveyed Blesma Members and their
  families to get a unique insight into how families live with limb loss. Please find the Blesma Families

- Tom also asked for any advice or information on appropriate care homes that could be used for Blesma members in Wales for respite or convalescence.
