3.0 UPDATE FROM WLGA / Welsh Government

LR advised the forum of the following from WLGA:

WLGA Armed Forces Network

The WLGA Armed Forces Network met on 26 May. The Network is made up of the 22 Local Authority Champions and Lead Officers and is also attended by Welsh Government, 160 Brigade, RBL and all the AFLOS.

National Armed Forces Day 2022-26

Local Authorities have agreed with WG a 5 year timetable for the hosting of a national Armed Forces Day in Wales 2022-26.

2022 - Wrexham

2023 – Newport

2024 - Swansea

2025 - Monmouthshire

2026 - Carmarthenshire

LR advised the forum of the following from Welsh Government

Veterans scoping exercise / Veterans strategy

- Work continues delivery of the recommendations of the Veterans scoping exercise which was published January 2020. Outcomes to date include 35% uplift in Veterans NHS Wales funding, publication of the first Wales Resettlement guide, funding of AFLOs to 2023, Employment event 25 November and funding for SSCE Cymru and service children.
- Welsh Government will now be updating the delivery plan to focus on recommendations that are yet to be completed. This reflects similar activity at UK and Scottish Governments. Area to be focused on include roll out of GP accreditation in Wales, further work in the criminal justice system and assessing current housing guidance.
- Welsh Government have raised the issue of transition services for service leavers and veterans in Wales with the MOD and will be pursuing as part of the next CTP contract discussions.

Covenant Legislation

 Partners in Wales have provided input into development of the statutory guidance to accompany the Covenant legislation which is now progressing through the House of Lords. Local authorities, AFLOs, LHBs and charity partners have been involved in this work. We await second draft of the guidance from MOD. Senedd will also be considering the issue – expected this autumn.

UK Armed forces annual report – due to be published this autumn.

Wales Covenant conference

Takes place virtually on 20 October – invite to be circulated. All welcome to attend.

UK Armed Forces families strategy – due for publication during October. Welsh Government supporting and will take forward via existing networks.

- In March 2021 we agreed total recurrent funding to Veterans NHS Wales from 2021 onwards of £920,000 per annum. This demonstrates a 35% increase in the government funding of this highly valued service for veterans in Wales.

- Support service leavers 2 years prior to leaving and up to two years after
- Current caseload 133 cases of which 20 are service leavers coming back to South Wales
- New assistant is from Cardiff and will stay based in Wales

- Year end (Sept) 98.9% achieved
- New member of staff Kelly Walker starting shortly
- Will expand to GPs and community mental health for referral partners

8.12 Change Step/Adferiad

- Attended a meeting with AFCT, Chester University and other partners across the UK on the suicide prevention work. An average of 3 adverse experiences at point of referral (for example financial, mental health, substance misuse, long term health conditions etc) the evaluation team ascertained that if you have removed one of the 3 things then the effect that it has on the family or individual is notable and key to engagement to support with other issues. Collaboration is key and if you have helped with any one of those things you have made a significant impact to those people.
- Currently those that are the highest category of risk are in South Wales and several in Caerphilly borough. 16 on register at the moment but suspect that there are more that need the support
