

**CAERPHILLY COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL
(A472 CROWN ROUNDABOUT TO MAESYCWMMER)
(SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2021**

The Caerphilly County Borough Council (the 'Council') in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the 'Act') and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Caerphilly County Borough Council (A472 Crown Roundabout to Maesycwmmmer) (Speed Limit) Order 2021 and shall come into operation on the day of XXX 2021.
2. Save as provided in Article 4 no person shall cause any vehicle to be driven at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour on the roads identified as 30mph speed limit on drawing number TH1318/02/04 attached to this order.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 no person shall cause any vehicle to be driven at a speed in excess of 40 miles per hour on the roads identified as 40mph speed limit on drawing number TH1318/02/04 attached to this order.
4. Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 applies to:
 - a) Any vehicle being used by the emergency services for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984
 - b) Any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes, and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of the member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces –
 - i) In response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
 - ii) For the purpose of training a person in driving at high speeds
 - c) 'special forces' means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director.
