

Trinity Protocol



What is Trinity Protocol?

As part of Gwent Police's protect and reassure mission we would like to introduce a ground breaking initiative - the **Trinity Protocol** - which is an additional tool used by the police to aid them in locating missing people with additional needs or dealing with emergencies involving people with additional needs.

In the event that a person with additional needs requires the police in an emergency and dials **999**, we can access information about them which may assist us in communicating with them and therefore be more efficient in dealing with the emergency.

If a person with special needs is missing and has completed a **Trinity Protocol** we can use the information to locate them and take them to a place of safety.

Alternatively, if the person is involved in a crime or is a victim of a crime, we can use their information to ensure that we know as much as possible about them and adapt our communication and approach appropriately.

All the information you provide will be kept confidential and used only for the benefit of the person the profile belongs to.

If possible, try to provide a recent, close-up photograph of the person whose profile this is.

You may wish to make copies for yourself, your child's school/college, family/relatives or even respite provisions.

If the person is missing then you **MUST** ring 999 and ensure you confirm you have completed the Trinity Protocol, so the operator is aware we have further information on the person.
